Event Description: The fall PCOP, IAPA, and SAAF program offers South Asian immigrants and others a psychological, intra-psychic understanding of cross socio-cultural aspects of mind.

In this fall's program, the preliminary remarks by Dr. Akhtar will elucidate four dynamic explanations of dreams: wish-fulfillment, posttraumatic effort at mastery, state-of-affairs reportage, and unconscious problem solving. The main lecture by Dr. Khushalani will then extend such understanding to the "Sureele" songs that contain varied meanings and serve multiple purposes for characters in typical Bollywood movies, while also serving various functions for the audience.
