This event will entail lecture and discussion on the difficulties encountered in the treatment of refugees who have suffered massive trauma before their immigration.

PRESENTER: Ilany Kogan, MA

Ilany Kogan is a Training Analyst at the Israel Psychoanalytic Society. She works as a teacher and supervisor at the Generatia Center in Bucharest, Romania, and in various places across Germany, in the fields of "Migration" and "Trauma".

For many years, Ilany Kogan worked extensively with Holocaust survivors' offspring and published papers and books on this topic. She was awarded the Elise M. Hayman Award for the Study of the Holocaust and Genocide (2005).
