Triangulation and Analytic Thirds: Working in the Transference

EVENT DESCRIPTION:

Dr. Kulish will examine the different notions of thirdness in the psychoanalytic literature and attempt to compare them with, and to differentiate them from, triangular “oedipal” transferences. She will present a case in which the patient concretely constructed a third by drawing a real person – another analyst – into the dyad. In the highly charged drama that ensued, issues of bisexuality, gender identity, and erotic fantasies toward both sexes were explored.

PRESENTER: Nancy Kulish, PhD

Dr. Kulish is a Professor in the Department of Psychiatry at Wayne State Medical School and an Adjunct Professor of Psychology at the University of Detroit/Mercy. She is a Training and Supervising Analyst at the Michigan Psychoanalytic Institute, where she was past president. She was chosen as the National Woman Psychoanalytic Scholar for 2005 of the American Psychoanalytic Association. Currently, she is on the Editorial Boards of the Psychoanalytic Quarterly and the International Journal of Psychoanalysis. She has published and presented on a wide range of topics including female sexuality, gender, transference/countertransference, adolescence, and termination.
