In this second installment of PCOP's new case conference series, second-year student Chris DiOrio, LPC, will present a challenging patient to discussant Mark Moore, PhD, psychoanalyst and former director of the PCOP psychotherapy training program. Discussion will focus on therapy technique and case formulation, demonstrating the relevance of classical analytic principles to psychotherapy today—even when working with difficult patient populations and in clinical settings different from those often presented in analytic literature. The discussion will provide practical examples of “what to say, when” in psychotherapy that attendees can apply to their own clinical work. Attendees will have the opportunity to discuss the material together in “break out” chat groups, followed by a question and answer period where you can pose questions to Chris and Mark regarding the case.

Chris DiOrio, LPC, recently completed the second year of the psychotherapy program at PCOP. He works with individuals and couples experiencing anxiety, depression, and challenges related to a history of trauma as well as substance use. Chris gained experience working in community mental health and outpatient D&A settings prior to entering private practice.

Mark Moore, PhD, is a clinical psychologist and psychoanalyst who works in private practice in Philadelphia. His clinical work focuses on health issues, notably chronic illness, losses and life transitions associated with cancer and the fear of dying. In addition to his clinical work, he has many years of experience supervising psychology interns and post-doctoral fellows at the Abramson Cancer Center at Pennsylvania Hospital. He has authored several book chapters on a variety of topics and has recently won the Edith Sabshin Teaching Award from the American Psychoanalytic Association. He is a past director of the Psychotherapy Training Program and a popular instructor at PCOP, teaching courses on psychoanalytic writing and the differences between psychotherapy and psychoanalysis.
