Developmental Psychoanalysis and the Promotion of Progressive Development: A Retrospective Discussion

Most children who enter analysis suffer from what Anna Freud called the mixed psychopathology of childhood, the interweaving of both conflict and developmental disturbances. The technical approach with these children is also mixed as the focus is not only on conflicts, but also on developmental imbalances and internal structural deficits. In this presentation, detailed clinical material from the analysis of a four-and-a-half-year-old girl will be outlined to elucidate this approach. In addition, when looking back at an analysis one always wonders if there were alternative ways of understanding the patient and what could have been done differently. Participants will have an opportunity to discuss, analyze and debate these issues.

Dr. Jill M. Miller is a Child, Adolescent and Adult Psychoanalyst in private practice in Washington, DC. She is a Clinical Professor in Psychiatry at the University of Colorado Medical School, and a Training and Supervising Analyst at the Washington Baltimore Center for Psychoanalysis. Dr. Miller teaches and supervises at a number of Institutes across the country, has presented nationally and internationally, and has published papers on a variety of topics related to child and adolescent analysis.
