### A DISCUSSION WITH OTTO KERNBERG, MD: A JOURNEY OF PSYCHOLOGICAL INQUIRY, DISCOVERY, AND SURPRISE

Dr. Otto Kernberg will discuss the development and evolution of his clinical and theoretical ideas regarding the diagnosis and treatment of severe personality disorders. Through questions from the moderator and others, he will show how earlier influential individuals helped orient him on a journey of learning and discovery, with a particular focus over many decades on studying and researching his concepts. Particular attention will involve the development of Transference Focused Psychotherapy for Pathologically Narcissistic and Borderline Personality Disordered individuals.

Otto F. Kernberg, M.D., F.A.P.A., is Director of the Personality Disorders Institute at The New York Presbyterian Hospital, Westchester Division, and Professor of Psychiatry at the Weill Medical College of Cornell University. Dr. Kernberg is a Past-President of the International Psychoanalytic Association. He is also Training and Supervising Analyst of the Columbia University Center for Psychoanalytic Training and Research. He is the author of 13 books and coauthor of 12 others, including: Borderline Conditions and Pathological Narcissism; Severe Personality Disorders: Psychotherapeutic Strategies; Contemporary Controversies in Psychoanalytic Theory, Techniques and their Applications; The Inseparable Nature of Love and Aggression; Psychoanalytic Education at the Crossroads; and, most recently, Resolution of Aggression and Recovery of Eroticism.
