Over the Moon was released in 2020, in the middle of Covid-19, as a cartoon animated movie about a 13-year-old girl. The plot revolves around Fei-Fei, an adventurous girl who misses her deceased mother and has difficulty accepting her father's new relationship. Fei-Fei wants to prove to the world that there is a mythical goddess on the moon, based on a story she heard as a child from her mother. For this, she builds a spaceship that will take her to the moon. Over the Moon is a fun loving story, with hint of a child's struggle about her own beliefs and acceptance of changes around her.

Dr. Elaine Xu is an adult psychiatrist at Cooper University Health Care where she works on the consult/liaison service and ambulatory clinic. She supervises residents and teaches medical students at the Cooper Medical School of Rowan University. She graduated from the Perelman School of Medicine at the University of Pennsylvania, where she stayed to complete her residency in adult psychiatry. Dr. Xu immigrated from China with her parents at age 5 and grew up mostly in the Boston suburbs. Her Chinese – Chinese-American identity has been central to her development, and she is passionate about Asian-American Pacific Islander (AAPI) issues, speaking on anti-AAPI racism in healthcare and psychiatry while in residency and at Cooper.

This year's Reel Thinking series will focus on American and International films with themes of developmental phases in adolescent and elderly age groups. Discussion will focus on psychosocial, cultural, and psychoanalytic perspectives that are helpful in clinical settings, including psychotherapy, and in overcoming conscious and unconscious biases.
