This forum will consider the centrality of death and how it has been thought about psychoanalytically from the time of Freud to today. It will also address the complex challenges that psychotherapists face in their work with their patients who come seeking help with death and dying. Dr. Emanuel will explore the many ways in which death motivates us, ranging from drive and fear to desire for love. She will also introduce us to her concept of Existential Maturity and the key points to utilize in existential therapy.

This activity is geared to clinicians, clergy and professionals who work with individuals and families. A case presentation will be offered along with theoretical findings.

Linda Emanuel, MD, is an academic physician focused on palliative and end of life care. More than a decade ago she began training as a psychoanalyst along side that. She is now professor emerita at Northwestern and in private practice as a psychoanalyst, still with a focus on people facing life-shortening illness or their family. She is a faculty member of the Chicago Psychoanalytic Institute and a member of the Boston Psychoanalytic Society & Institute.

Mark Moore, PhD. will be the discussant. Dr. Moore's extensive and rich work with cancer patients should provide an illuminating discussion.
