"Inauditum!...Conscience, Awareness, Integration: Analysis as a Post-Traumatic Experience"

In this Forum presentation, Dr. Bolognini will explore three things: 1) a personal experience that reflects his ideas about how pivotal auditory processing and sound is to our experience and memory of strong affects, 2) the varied experiences that patients feel when the analyst is silent; and 3) how the experience of hearing assumes decisive importance for the analytic process of a patient impacted by a traumatic loss.

The presentation will explore the nature of sound in the utterances of the analyst and the patient, as well as surrounding sounds. How is the analyst's silence experienced by the patient, and visa versa? What happens in the space between the analyst and analysand when sound intrudes and how can sound from past trauma or experience reawaken feelings in the patient as they unfold over the course of a treatment? Dr. Bolognini will offer personal as well as clinical moments to illustrate his ideas about how powerful interacting forces of affect and cognition shape the relationship between patient and analyst and how to engage techniques to facilitate therapeutic process. Following Dr. Bolognini's lecture, the audience will have plenty of time for discussion with Dr. Bolognini.

Presenters

Stefano Bolognini, MD, is a psychiatrist, training and supervising analyst, and is Past-President of the Italian Psychoanalytic Society (SPI) and of the International Psychoanalytical Association (IPA). He is also Founder and Chair of the IPA Inter-Regional Encyclopedic Dictionary of Psychoanalysis (IRED). Dr. Bolognini is an Honorary Member of the New York Contemporary Freudian Society (NYCFS), Honorary Member of the Los Angeles Institute and Society for Psychoanalytic Studies (LAISPS), and is also an Honorary Member of the Florence Psychoanalytic Center (CPF).

Besides 250 psychoanalytic papers published in Italian and foreign journals, some of his books have been translated and published in several languages including: The Dream, a Hundred Years Later (1998); Psychoanalytic Empathy (2002); Secret Passages: Theory and Clinic of the Interpsychic (2008); Das Ereignis der Einfuehlung. Zwei Psychoanalytische Reflexionen (2017). His most recent book Vital Flows Between Self and Not-Self (2019), deals with the difference among interpsychic, intersubjective and interpersonal, and is in the publication process by Routledge, London. Dr. Bolognini is also an author of short stories, and wrote Like Wind, Like Wave (2006), a series of fables that illustrate psychoanalytic concepts. Dr. Bolognini lives and works in private practice in Bologna, Italy.

Salman Akhtar, MD, is a Professor of Psychiatry at Jefferson Medical College and a Training and Supervising Analyst at the Psychoanalytic Center of Philadelphia. He has served on the editorial boards of the International Journal of Psychoanalysis, the Journal of the American Psychoanalytic Association, and the Psychoanalytic Quarterly. He has more than 400 publications including 99 books, of which 20 are solo-authored. His most recently published books include Mind Culture and Global Unrest (2018), Silent Virtues (2019), and his 100th book entitled, Tales of Transformation: A Life in Psychotherapy and Psychoanalysis (2020).
