## AND NOW. LOVE

This is a documentary directed and produced by Jill Demby Guest. It is about the remarkable life of 96-year-old, Jewish World War II hero, Dr. Bernard Bail. The film explores his motivational journey as an imprisoned hero, gathering spiritual understanding of often unattainable love, and his ultimate revolutionizing of the psychoanalytic process, with a new theory called "the mother's imprint".

**Dr. Ira Brenner** is Clinical Professor of Psychiatry at Jefferson Medical College, and Training and Supervising Analyst at the Psychoanalytic Center of Philadelphia. He chairs the Holocaust Discussion Group and co-chairs the Dissociative Disorders Discussion Group at the American Psychoanalytic Association meetings. He has authored of over 100 publications, co-edited three special issues of *The International Journal of Applied Psychoanalytic Studies*, and has published 6 books: *The Last Witness - The Child Survivor of the Holocaust*, (with Judith Kestenberg) (1996); *Dissociation of Trauma* (2001); *Psychic Trauma* (2004); *Injured Men* (2009), *Dark Matters - Exploring the Realm of Psychic Devastation* (2014), and *The Handbook of Psychoanalytic Holocaust Studies - International Perspectives* (2020). He maintains a practice of adults and children in the greater Philadelphia area.

Jill Demby Guest is an Emmy nominated and film festival award winning producer, writer, and director. She began her career trained by the Maysles Brothers (*Grey Gardens, Gimme Shelter*) and went on to edit and produce many films for public television at WNET-NY (*James Cagney: That Yankee Doodle Dandy, Willa Cather's America*) and KCET-LA where she was nominated for an Emmy for a portrait of the African-American sculptor Charles Dickson in their series *Take Five: The Arts.* She has worked extensively with Disney and Warner Brothers, directing and producing documentaries for their DVD releases (*The West Wing, John Lennon: Imagine with Yoko Ono, High School Musical, Whatever Happened to Baby Jane* and *National Treasure*, among others) and for Lifetime television's Intimate Portrait series (*Cindy Williams*). In addition, she has expertise in branded entertainment and entertainment marketing as a creative director and commercial producer for Disney, Warner Bros and advertising agencies. Jill is also an audiobook producer and professional storyteller, performing true life stories all over stages in LA and NY. (Sit'n'Spin at the Comedy Central Stage, Los Angeles). Her latest feature documentary, *And Now, Love*, has won two Best Documentary and Best Director Awards at several film festivals.

This year's Reel Thinking series will focus on American and International films with themes of developmental phases in adolescent and elderly age groups. Discussion will focus on psychosocial, cultural, and psychoanalytic perspectives that are helpful in clinical settings, including psychotherapy, and in overcoming conscious and unconscious biases.
