ABOUT THE PROGRAM

"In wartime, children suffer the most." * and globally, one in four children, or over 1.6 billion children currently live in a country affected by armed conflict, terrorism, or disaster. Parents are the mitigators of suffering for children but wars can adversely affect parenting. How well parents able to maintain warmth, structure, are discipline, monitoring and problem solving is associated with how children adjust, survive and recover from wartime conditions. Dr. Gewirtz will review the effects of the stressors of war on children and on parenting. She will talk specifically about the effect of a parent's wartime military experience and the impact of war exposure and flight on parenting. She will also talk about the effect of transition stressors on parenting and on children's adjustment. What can be done to help children and parents in the wake of war will be discussed and the few programs to support parenting that have been developed and tested will be described.

ABOUT DR. GEWIRTZ

Dr. Abigail Gewirtz is a child psychologist, mother of four, leading expert on helping families cope with trauma and the author of When the World Feels Like a Scary Place: Essential Conversations for Anxious Parents and Worried Children (Workman, 2020). She is Foundation Professor in the Psychology Department at Arizona State University. Dr. Gewirtz has worked as a clinician, researcher, program developer, and trainer of providers, and is the author of more than 100 publications. A fellow of the Association for Psychological Science and the American Psychological Association, Dr. Gewirtz has conducted research in the United States, Asia, the Middle East, and Africa, and has been invited to speak widely, in the U.S. and across the world, on parenting in times of stress.
